

Cuppa for One Cosy

Gather your materials:

- 1/3 yard fabric for front and back
- 1/3 yard fabric for lining
- Quilt batting or Insul-Bright lining
- Ribbon or rickrack

From your main material, cut one front and one back using pattern piece provided. In this example, I used a vintage tea towel for the front with a coordinating print for the back. Cut two lining pieces, and two pieces of batting.



Baste a piece of batting to both the front and back pieces, using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Cut a 2" length of ribbon or rickrack. Fold in half, and baste to the top corner of the back side piece, as shown:



With right sides facing each other, pin front and back together. Stitch around the sides and top using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam. Turn right side out and press.

Pin lining pieces together, with right sides facing. Stitch $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam around sides, leaving a 2" opening on one side as shown:



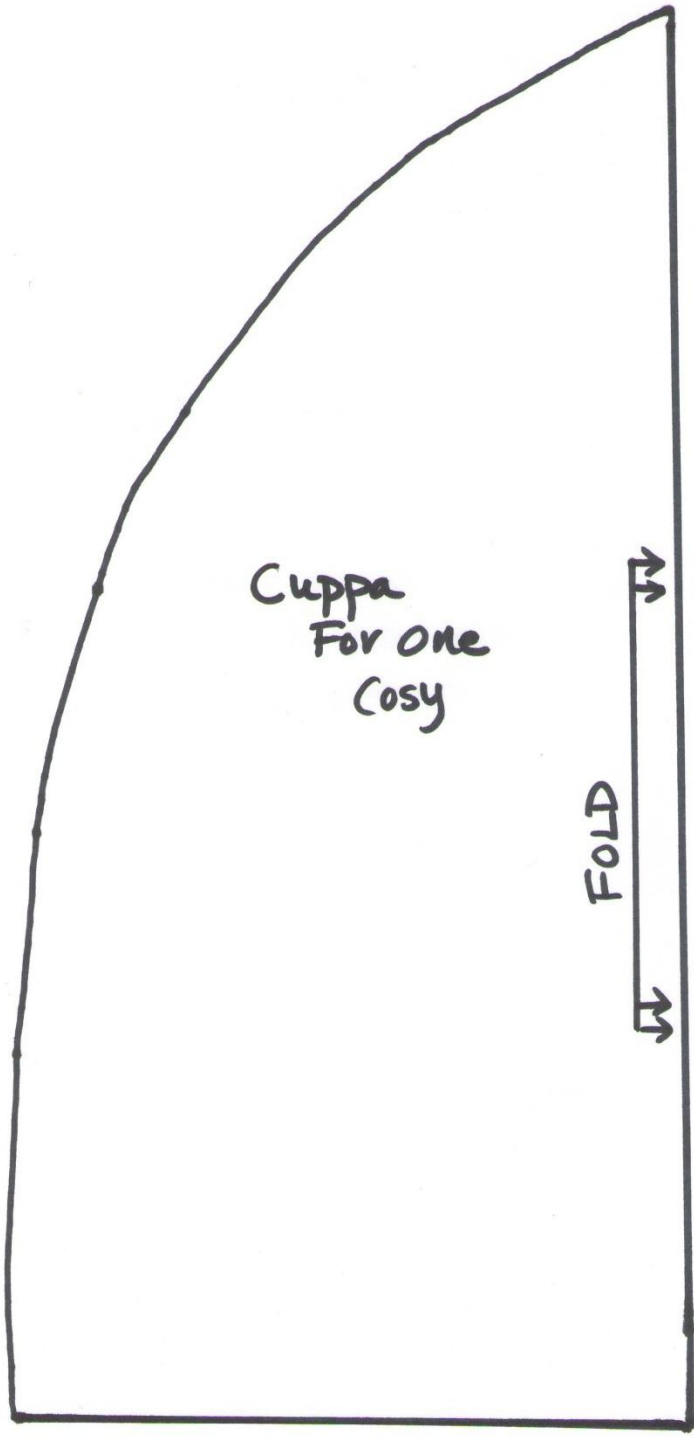
Now, with right sides together, pin outer cosy piece to the lining piece along the bottom edge.



Stitch around using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam. Turn right side out using the opening left on the side of the lining piece.



Slip stitch, or machine stitch the opening closed. Push the lining inside the cosy, and press. Embellish as desired. Use and enjoy!
